

INTERIM REPORT Q1 2025

Ellos Group was formed on 15 October 2024 when the Parent company Ellos Holding AB (publ) acquired all shares in Ellos Group Nordic AB (publ). Consequently, the financial report does not contain any comparative figures for the first quarter of the previous year.

1 JANUARY-31 MARCH 2025

- Net sales for the Group amounted to SEK 801.6 million during the period.
- The gross profit amounted to SEK 330.5 million with a gross margin* of 41.2 %.
- Adjusted EBITA* amounted to SEK 32.2 million with an adjusted EBITA margin* of 4.0 %.
- Operating profit* amounted to SEK 14.4 million with an operating margin* of 1.8 %.
- Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK -63.6 million.
- Inventories amounted to SEK 678.8 million at the end of the period.

COMMENTS FROM THE CEO

ELLOS GROUP DELIVERS A STRONG FIRST QUARTER WITH INCREASED SALES AND PROFITABILITY

Ellos Group kicked off the year by delivering a successful first quarter of 2025 with net sales of SEK 802 million and each e-commerce site – Ellos, Jotex and Homeroom – increased sales. We report an adjusted EBITA of SEK 32.2 million and an operating profit of SEK 14.4 million, both representing significant improvements compared to the same period last year.

Performance was positive for Fashion during the quarter, with contribution from all main segments: clothing, underwear, activewear and footwear. It is also gratifying to see some recovery and increased sales in Home Furnishings, driven mainly by strong performance in the textile segments. We are also seeing recovery for Home Furnishings in the European markets where Jotex sells directly to consumers.

During the quarter we continued to strengthen our position in the market by offering attractive, and relevant products to our core customer. We are pleased to see that our creative campaigns – including Ellos's party collection 'Endless Bloom' and Ellos Home's spring collection focused on home rejuvenation – have produced results and are appreciated by our customers.

Our private labels now account for around two-thirds of sales, and they are also expanding outside our own channels in platforms such as Zalando and Amazon. This is confirmation that our products are popular and in demand among both consumers and partners. Our collaborations with for example Carolina Gynning and Carina Berg have also brought more visibility and energy to our offer, particularly within Fashion.

The increase in sales – along with a higher gross margin, good efficiency and cost control – were contributing factors for the quarter's improved earnings performance. We also see evident positive effects on both interest costs and cash flow from the improved capital structure. The period's result increased significantly compared to the same period last year reaching SEK -14.0 million, despite including depreciation of acquisition-related intangible assets amounting to SEK 17.2 million.

We published our sustainability report during the quarter, based for the first time on the Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive (CSRD). We have continued implementation of our climate transition plan by specifying targets for 2025 and working to improve transparency and traceability throughout our supply chain. This is an important process as we continue to integrate sustainability as a core component of our overall strategy.

While we are pleased with Ellos Group's strong performance, we also need to address the prevailing uncertainty in the wider world. My view is that the current environment is difficult to read and is providing less clarity. Consumer behaviour may be negatively affected by the impact of trade agreements and potential tariffs caused by political decisions.

Despite all of this, we are optimistic about 2025 and are looking forward to many positive growth opportunities. Our view is that we have strengthened our position in the market, and we remain confident that e-commerce will grow structurally.

We continue to follow our strategy and we remain on track. Our focus is on continuously improving our offer to our core customers and maintaining our focus on growth, greater efficiency and improved cash flow. With long-term financing that supports growth and with owners who believe strongly in Ellos Group's future potential, we are determined to maintain the positive momentum we have had so far this year.

I am very much looking forward to continuing our positive, profitable journey as a leading shopping destination in the Nordics, together with our fantastic employees.

THE QUARTER IN BRIEF

SALES

Net sales for the period amounted to SEK 801.6 million of which 54.0~% referred to customers in Sweden.

The net sales are distributed among revenues from e-commerce sales to customers, invoiced fees for services such as shipping, royalties for the use of Ellos product collections, and additional purchase price from the sale of invoice and installment receivables. The additional purchase price is based on the net income (interest less expenses) generated by the customer, with the Group's partner Resurs Bank, regarding the customer's purchases from Ellos Group.

The Group operates in four main geographical areas where the Group also has companies — Sweden (the company's headquarters), Norway, Finland and Denmark. The Swedish group company Ellos AB also sells to consumers in Germany, Poland, the Netherlands and Austria under the brand Jotex. The Group also sells goods to consumers around Europe via external trading platforms. In addition, some B2B sales take place in Europe. The royalty which the Group receives comes from companies in the USA.

GROSS PROFIT

The cost of goods sold amounted to SEK 471.1 million for the period. The cost of goods sold includes all costs for purchasing and distributing products to customers. The costs included in addition to the cost of goods for the products are, for example, shipping, customs, environmental fees, storage costs and costs for distributing goods to customers.

Gross profit for the period amounted to SEK 330.5 million and the gross margin amounted to 41.2 %.

OPERATING COSTS

Selling expenses amounted to SEK 209.4 million. The selling expenses mainly include costs for personnel handling goods within the Group's logistics facility, marketing costs, costs for customer service and the market function, as well as IT costs related to sales. The item also includes amortisation of acquisition-related customer relations of SEK 17.2 million

Administration expenses amounted to SEK 116.1 million. The administrative expenses include costs for the Group's central functions as product, sourcing, IT, finance, people & culture as well as costs for office premises, return handling, and management and also IT costs for administrative systems.

Other income amounted to SEK 9.4 million and mainly refers to exchange rate gains from the translation of receivables and liabilities in foreign currency.

ADJUSTED EBITA

Adjusted EBITA amounted to SEK 32.2 million with an EBITA margin of 4.0 percent. Non-recurring items refer to additional costs for refinancing carried out in the previous year.

FINANCIAL ITEMS

Financial income amounted to SEK 4.6 million and mainly consists of interest income on the Group's bank deposits.

Financial expenses amounted to SEK 31.5 million and mainly consist of interest expenses of SEK 28.2 million, of which interest expenses for bond loans amounted to SEK 20.4 million and interest expenses for lease liabilities amounted to SEK 3.0 million.

TAX

Income tax for the period amounted to SEK -1.5 million of which SEK -4.3 million pertains to current tax and SEK 2.8 million pertains to deferred tax.

PROFIT/LOSS

Profit/loss for the period amounted to SEK -14.0 million.

CASH FLOW

Cash flow from operating activities amounted to SEK -63.6 million, which is in line with the normal seasonal variation for working capital during the first quarter. The cash flow includes bond loan interest expenses amounting to SEK 20.4 million.

Inventories increased during the period by SEK 17.1 million, which had a negative effect on cash flow. The inventory amounts to SEK 678.8 million, which can be compared with SEK 661.7 million at the beginning of the year. Accounts payable decreased during the period by SEK 28.4 million and had a negative effect on cash flow.

Cash flow from investing activities amounted to SEK -4.0 million of which SEK -3.4 million pertains to acquisition of intangible fixed assets, SEK -0.3 million to acquisition of tangible fixed assets and SEK -0.3 million to change of financial fixed assets.

Cash flow from financing activities amounted to SEK -18.8 million and mainly refer to amortisation of lease liabilities of SEK -18.7 million.

Cash and cash equivalents amounted to SEK 95.9 million at the end of the period and cash flow for the period totalled SEK -86.4 million.

AVERAGE NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES

The average number of employees in the Group amounted to 486 people during the period.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS DURING THE QUARTER

No significant events have occurred during the quarter.

EVENTS AFTER THE END OF THE REPORTING PERIOD

No significant events have occurred after the end of the period.

RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Group is exposed to several risks, for example in areas such as currency, interest rate and financing as well as competition, the economy and IT security, and these risks can affect operations and earnings.

The worldwide situation means that there is great uncertainty linked to consumer purchasing power due to the macroeconomic situation and a general concern driven by the geopolitical situation.

For a more detailed description of the Group's identified risks, please refer to the 2024 annual report.

PLEDGED ASSETS

The Group has issued bonds totaling SEK 1,163.8 million. The collateral provided for the credits includes corporate mortgages, pledged shares in the Group's companies, pledged intra-group loans, and pledged receivables in Norwegian subsidiaries. Additionally, the Group's companies have provided a general unlimited guarantee. There are also capital insurance policies pledged for pension commitments and pledged bank accounts for issued bank guarantees and derivatives.

PARENT COMPANY

The Parent company's operating loss for the quarter amounted to SEK -0.5 million. The Parent company's income consists of intra-group services and the main costs were insurance costs, consultant costs and board fees. Financial items amounted to SEK -8.6 million and mainly consist of interest income on intra-group loans, interest expenses on issued bonds, and costs for credits.

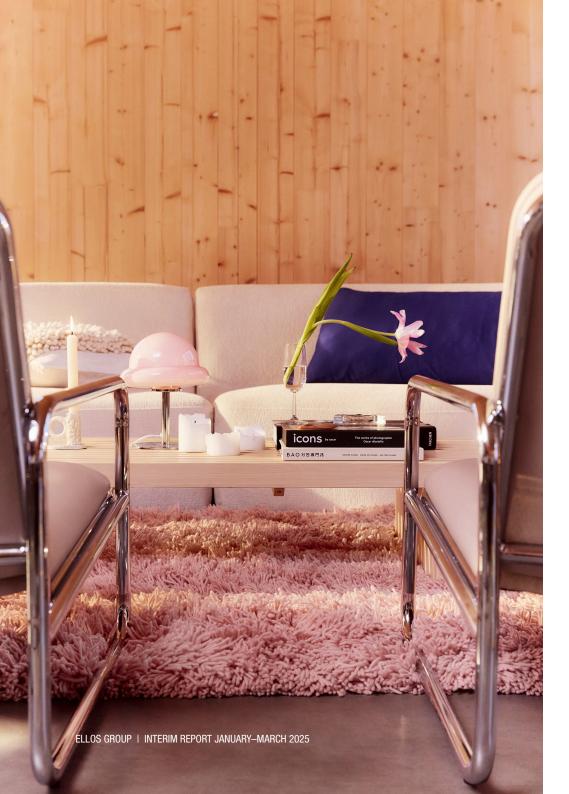

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 | GENERAL INFORMATION

Ellos Holding AB (publ), company registration number 559495-4116, is a limited company registered in Sweden with registered office in Borås. The Company's address is: PO Box 961, 501 10 Borås.

Unless otherwise stated, all amounts are shown in SEK millions.

NOTE 2 | SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General information

The consolidated financial statements for Ellos Holding AB (publ) have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) as adopted by the EU and issued by International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) and interpretations issued by the IFRS Interpretations Committee (IFRIC). Furthermore, the Group also applies the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Financial Reporting Board's recommendation, RFR 1 Supplementary Accounting Rules for Groups. This interim report has been prepared in accordance with IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting.

The accounting principles applied in the interim report are consistent with the accounting principles described in the Annual report 2024.

Accounting principles for the parent company

The Parent company applies the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Financial Reporting Board's recommendation RFR 2 Accounting for Legal Entities. Application of RFR 2 means the Parent company must, as far as possible, apply all IFRS adopted by the EU within the framework of the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Pension Obligations Vesting Act, and consider the relationship between accounting and taxation.

NOTE 3 | SIGNIFICANT ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

The preparation of an interim report requires management to make assessments and estimates as well as assumptions that affect the application of the accounting principles and reported amounts for assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual outcome may deviate from these estimates and judgments.

A more detailed description of significant estimates and judgments made by the Group's management is provided in the Annual report 2024.

NOTE 4 | TRANSACTIONS WITH RELATED PARTIES

Transactions between companies that are subsidiaries in the Ellos Holding AB (publ) group, which are related parties, have been eliminated in the consolidation and information on these transactions is therefore not disclosed in this note.

The Group has not provided any loans to people in the circle of related parties. Related party relationships exist with people in key senior management roles. No material transactions has occured with related parties except for salaries and remuneration to senior executives.

Net sales recognised in the Parent company consist solely of intra-group sales.

NOTE 5 | FAIR VALUE FINANCIAL INTRUMENTS

The Group's financial instruments measured at fair value as at 31 March 2025 comprise of currency derivatives. Derivatives contracts with positive values amounted to SEK 1.4 million. Derivatives transactions are accounted for at gross value.

Financial assets and financial liabilities valued at fair value in the balance sheet (derivatives) are categorized according to the three-level fair value hierarchy in IFRS 13 (Level 1, 2 or 3). Measurement of all currency derivatives is categorized in Level 2. Currency forwards are valued based on observable information regarding the currency rates and market interest rates as at the rates and market interest rates as at the balance sheet date for the remaining term.

RECONSILIATION OF APM, NOT DEFINED ACCORDING TO IFRS

Some of the financial alternative performance measures (APM) in this report, which are used to assess the Group's performance, are not defined in IFRS. Management believes that these financial performance measures facilitate analysis and evaluation of this report and provide valuable information to increase the ability to make comparisons between periods. This information should be regarded as complementing, rather than replacing, financial reporting according to IFRS. The Group's definitions of these financial measures may differ from other companies' definitions of the same terms. Unless otherwise stated, all amounts are shown in SEK millions, SEK M.
